

COURSE FRAMEWORK UNDER NEP 2020

Introduction

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) is a comprehensive policy introduced by the Government of India to transform the education system in the country. It aims to bring about significant changes in various aspects of education, from school to higher education. Student who wish to seek admission in DRT's A.E Kalsekar Degree College, Kausa -Mumbra are adviced to visit college website or Mumbai University website for admission details under NEP 2020.

Salient Features of NEP2020

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) in India brings several significant changes compared to the prevalent education policy at the time of its introduction. Here are some key differences between the prevalent education policy and NEP2020:

- Multidisciplinary Approach: promotes a multidisciplinary approach to education, encouraging students to choose subjects across different disciplines and bridging the gap between arts, sciences, and humanities.
- Skill Development and Vocational Education: places significant importance on skill development and vocational education, aiming to provide students with practical skills and promote entrepreneurship.
 Assessment Reforms: NEP 2020 advocates for a shift in assessment methods focusing on a more
- comprehensive and holistic assessment of student understanding and skills.
- Inclusion and Equity: NEP 2020 emphasizes inclusion and equity in education, aiming to address gender
 and social disparities, provide equal opportunities for marginalized communities, and promote inclusive education for students with disabilities.
 - Research and Innovation: NEP 2020 recognizes the importance of research and innovation in education,
- encouraging the establishment of research centers and promoting a culture of research among students and teachers.

The implementation will start for First year (Level 4.5) from academic year 2024-25 and will be applicable gradually for next level in next academic year. The framework of the choice-based credit system as under:

Major Subject: M1 or M1, M2, M3 model as applicable to the Stream pursued by a student is a mandatory requirement of the programme of study. Student can choose the major subject as applicable to the respective stream.

Minor Subject: If applicable a second subject of study pursued by a student as an additional requirement of the programme of study.

Elective Course: An elective course (If applicable) could be a project designed to acquire skills to supplement the major study.

OE: Open Elective - An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, to seek multidisciplinary exposure.

AEC: Ability Enhancement Course - Mandatory Courses on content related to Language, and Literature (i) Compulsory – English communication (ii) Elective – any Indian language other than English.

VSC: Vocational Skill Course – Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase the employability of students. Specific or supporting the major subject is to be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the college.

SEC: Skill Enhancement Course – Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase students' employability. It could be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the university or a MOOC on Swayam or NPTEL platforms.

IKS: Indian knowledge system (IKS) to be included in the core courses.

On-Job Training (OJT)/Internship/Field Project (FP)/Community Engagement Programme (CEP) Research Project (RP): Application of knowledge/concepts in solving or analyzing a real-life problem. All these are related to the major subject.

CC: Co-curricular Course – For the holistic development of students through Cultural activities such as performing art, visual art, NCC, NSS, Yoga, etc.

VEC: Value Education Course - Compulsory courses on (i) The Constitution of India and

(ii) Environmental Education.

Academic Bank Credit (ABC)

As per NEP 2020, Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) has been envisaged to facilitate the academic mobility of students with the freedom to study across the Higher Education Institution in the country. The use of ABC credits improves transparency and helps to introduce a more flexible approach to curriculum design and development. Link for creating ABC Account for students: https://www.abc.gov.in/

On successful completion of three years and obtaining 132 credits, a student can opt for an exit with a bachelor's degree in their domain, e.g., BSc/BA/B.Com. The student must have a minimum CGPA of 7.5, to be eligible to obtain an 'Honours' degree. They would need to complete the fourth year of the said programme and acquire 176 credits for a bachelor's degree with Honours. If a student opts for an Honours degree by Research, the eligibility criteria will be at the discretion of the College if applicable in academic year 2024-25.

Admission Path at Different Levels for Four-year Multidisciplinary Degree Programme

- a. First Year Entry 1, Level 4.5 (As applicable from Academic Year 2024-25.)
 - Students who have successfully completed the Grade 12 School Leaving Certificate or equivalent shall be eligible for admission to a first-year degree programme.
 - The entry requirement for Level 4.5 is the Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate obtained after completing Grade 12 or Level 4 successfully which ever applicable.
 - A programme of study leading to entry into the first year in any discipline of the Bachelor's degree is applicable as per University of Mumbai eligibility rules.
 - The admission shall be made on merit based on criteria notified by the university, keeping in view the
 guidelines/norms issued by the UGC, the government of Maharashtra and other statutory bodies
 concerned and taking into account the reservation policy as and when issued by the Government of
 Maharashtra from time to time, as applicable to minority Insitution.
- b. 2nd year Entry 2 Level 5.0
- c. 3rd year Entry 3 Level 5.5
- d. 4th year Entry 4 Level 6 (P.G. First Year)
- e. 5th year Entry 5 Level 6.5 (P.G. Second Year)

Lateral Entry/ Re-entry at Higher Levels

As per NEP 2020 Guidelines

Students who leave with a Certification, Diploma, or a Bachelor's Degree will be eligible to re-enter the programme at the exit level to complete or progress to the next level through lateral entry mode. A student will be allowed to Enter/ Re Enter only during odd semester. However, in terms of the admission eligibility requirements, the student must belong to the same faculty/ discipline in terms of Major Subject i.e., the Major subject of his/her earlier programme and the Major subject of a new programme for which he/she is seeking admission must be from the same faculty/discipline. Reservation for lateral entry will have to be executed as per the Government of Maharashtra Norms. M1 Model followed in Commerce & Self Finance course. M1, M2, M3 model followed in Arts & Science.

Major 1 subject offered under M1, M2, M3 model will continue to till level 5.5 (Third Year).

Major 2 subject offered under M1, M2, M3 model, will continure 5th Sem in 5.5 (Third Year).

Major 3 subject offered under M1, M2, M3 will be offered only at Sem I and Sem II level 4.5 First Year.

There will be semester End Exam (External - 60 and continuous assessment Internal - 40). The Scheme of Exam will be 60:40. Individual passing in Internal and External Examination.

COLLEGE RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT

On admission each student will receive an IDENTITY CARD No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the possession of a valid identity card, which must be produced on demand by any competent authority.

- 7. Students must attend classes, practicals and tutorials according to the Time -Table on all working days of the college Absence may lead to loss of a term. A term is granted to a student whose attendance is above 75% and who completes the course of study prescribed. Employed students are not entitled for any concessions
- 8. Student should take care to be punctual. They will not be admitted into the class room if they are late by more than five minutes, Attendance Register will be sent to the classes and the student mark absent for that lecture will be considered to have been absent for that full day.
- 9. Absence from lecture must be Justified in writing in stipulated time. and if illness is the cause a medical certificate must be submitted immediately.
- 10. Students must not attend classes other than their own.
- 11. Students are not allowed to form any society, group make collections, sell tickets hold meeting invite person to address them and go on excursions or picnic without the permission of the Principal.
- 12. All notices put up on the notice board or any announcements made must have previous approval of the Principal.
- 13. All the associations and committees constituted by the Principal to conduct various student activities should not hold meetings and publish wall papers hand bills etc. without prior approval of the Principal.
- 14. Every kind of demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the college or disputes any activity in the college is banned.
- 15. Attendance for tests and examinations conducted by the college is compulsory. Defaulters should be not allowed to appear in the Annual Examination or Examinations conducted by the University.





COURSE FRAMEWORK UNDER NEP 2020

Introduction

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) is a comprehensive policy introduced by the Government of India to transform the education system in the country. It aims to bring about significant changes in various aspects of education, from school to higher education. Student who wish to seek admission in DRT's A.E Kalsekar Degree College, Kausa-Mumbra are adviced to visit college website or Mumbai University website for admission details under NEP 2020.

Salient Features of NEP2020

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) in India brings several significant changes compared to the prevalent education policy at the time of its introduction. Here are some key differences between the prevalent education policy and NEP2020:

- Multidisciplinary Approach: promotes a multidisciplinary approach to education, encouraging students to choose subjects across different disciplines and bridging the gap between arts, sciences, and humanities.
- Skill Development and Vocational Education: places significant importance on skill development and vocational education, aiming to provide students with practical skills and promote entrepreneurship.
 Assessment Reforms: NEP 2020 advocates for a shift in assessment methods focusing on a more
- comprehensive and holistic assessment of student understanding and skills.
- Inclusion and Equity: NEP 2020 emphasizes inclusion and equity in education, aiming to address gender
- and social disparities, provide equal opportunities for marginalized communities, and promote inclusive education for students with disabilities.
 - Research and Innovation: NEP 2020 recognizes the importance of research and innovation in education,
- encouraging the establishment of research centers and promoting a culture of research among students and teachers.

The implementation will start for First year (Level 4.5) from academic year 2024-25 and will be applicable gradually for next level in next academic year. The framework of the choice-based credit system as under:

Major Subject: M1 or M1, M2, M3 model as applicable to the Stream pursued by a student is a mandatory requirement of the programme of study. Student can choose the major subject as applicable to the respective stream.

Minor Subject: If applicable a second subject of study pursued by a student as an additional requirement of the programme of study.

Elective Course: An elective course (If applicable) could be a project designed to acquire skills to supplement the major study.

OE: Open Elective - An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, to seek multidisciplinary exposure.

AEC: Ability Enhancement Course - Mandatory Courses on content related to Language, and Literature (i) Compulsory – English communication (ii) Elective – any Indian language other than English.

VSC: Vocational Skill Course – Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase the employability of students. Specific or supporting the major subject is to be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the college.

SEC: Skill Enhancement Course – Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase students' employability. It could be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the university or a MOOC on Swayam or NPTEL platforms.

IKS: Indian knowledge system (IKS) to be included in the core courses.

On-Job Training (OJT)/Internship/Field Project (FP)/Community Engagement Programme (CEP) Research Project (RP): Application of knowledge/concepts in solving or analyzing a real-life problem. All these are related to the major subject.

CC: Co-curricular Course – For the holistic development of students through Cultural activities such as performing art, visual art, NCC, NSS, Yoga, etc.

VEC: Value Education Course - Compulsory courses on (i) The Constitution of India and

(ii) Environmental Education.

Academic Bank Credit (ABC)

As per NEP 2020, Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) has been envisaged to facilitate the academic mobility of students with the freedom to study across the Higher Education Institution in the country. The use of ABC credits improves transparency and helps to introduce a more flexible approach to curriculum design and development. Link for creating ABC Account for students: https://www.abc.gov.in/

On successful completion of three years and obtaining 132 credits, a student can opt for an exit with a bachelor's degree in their domain, e.g., BSc/BA/B.Com. The student must have a minimum CGPA of 7.5, to be eligible to obtain an 'Honours' degree. They would need to complete the fourth year of the said programme and acquire 176 credits for a bachelor's degree with Honours. If a student opts for an Honours degree by Research, the eligibility criteria will be at the discretion of the College if applicable in academic year 2024-25.

Admission Path at Different Levels for Four-year Multidisciplinary Degree Programme

- a. First Year Entry 1, Level 4.5 (As applicable from Academic Year 2024-25.)
 - Students who have successfully completed the Grade 12 School Leaving Certificate or equivalent shall be eligible for admission to a first-year degree programme.
 - The entry requirement for Level 4.5 is the Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate obtained after completing Grade 12 or Level 4 successfully which ever applicable.
 - A programme of study leading to entry into the first year in any discipline of the Bachelor's degree is applicable as per University of Mumbai eligibility rules.
 - The admission shall be made on merit based on criteria notified by the university, keeping in view the
 guidelines/norms issued by the UGC, the government of Maharashtra and other statutory bodies
 concerned and taking into account the reservation policy as and when issued by the Government of
 Maharashtra from time to time, as applicable to minority Insitution.
- b. 2nd year Entry 2 Level 5.0
- c. 3rd year Entry 3 Level 5.5
- d. 4th year Entry 4 Level 6 (P.G. First Year)
- e. 5th year Entry 5 Level 6.5 (P.G. Second Year)

Lateral Entry/ Re-entry at Higher Levels

As per NEP 2020 Guidelines

Students who leave with a Certification, Diploma, or a Bachelor's Degree will be eligible to re-enter the programme at the exit level to complete or progress to the next level through lateral entry mode. A student will be allowed to Enter/ Re Enter only during odd semester. However, in terms of the admission eligibility requirements, the student must belong to the same faculty/ discipline in terms of Major Subject i.e., the Major subject of his/her earlier programme and the Major subject of a new programme for which he/she is seeking admission must be from the same faculty/discipline. Reservation for lateral entry will have to be executed as per the Government of Maharashtra Norms. M1 Model followed in Commerce & Self Finance course. M1, M2, M3 model followed in Arts & Science.

Major 1 subject offered under M1, M2, M3 model will continue to till level 5.5 (Third Year).

Major 2 subject offered under M1, M2, M3 model, will continure 5th Sem in 5.5 (Third Year).

Major 3 subject offered under M1, M2, M3 will be offered only at Sem I and Sem II level 4.5 First Year.

There will be semester End Exam (External - 60 and continuous assessment Internal - 40). The Scheme of Exam will be 60:40. Individual passing in Internal and External Examination.



STRUCTURE AND DETAILS OF BMS

From Academic Year 2024-25 BMS course is affiliated with AICTE.

Subject and Syllabus for FYBMS will be made available as per NEP Policy by AICTE in due course of time and the same will be uploaded on college website. https://aekalsekarcollege.ac.in/

Eligibility Criteria for FYBMS

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the B.M.S. Degree Course shall have passed H.S.C. Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination or Diploma in any Engineering branches with two years or three years duration after S.S.C. conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or its equivalent examination by securing minimum 45% marks for Open Category and 40% Marks for Reserved category (in one attempt) at the respective Examination (Eligibility as per University of Mumbai).

A candidate must secure minimum 45% marks for Open Category and 40% Marks for Reserved category (in one attempt) at the respective Examination (Eligibility as per AICTE Norms).

A candidate must appear BMS-CET 2024 Exam conducted by State Common Entrance Cell (w.e.f from academic year 2024-25).

While drawing the merit list, weightage has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at 12th standard level. The stream wise weightage to be given is as under:

Stream :- Commerce (45%) Arts (25%) Science (25%) Diploma in Engineering and Other (5%). The applications are to be accepted and processed by the colleges stream wise separately and the merit list is to be displayed stream wise taking into account the reservation policy prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra. The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.

In case if no applications are received under the 'Diploma in Engineering and other Category" or if the seats remain vacant in "Diploma in Engineering and other Category" after all the merit f ists/forms are exhausted, the vacant seats must be transferred to Commerce Stream.

Benefits to the student seeking Admission in BMS under AICTE approval.

- 1. Students will become eligible to avail scholarship offered by AICTE (e.g. PRAGATHI, SAKSHAM, etc.).
- 2. Students will get benefits available through AICTE NEAT Scheme.
- 3. Students will become eligible to avail the benefits of Internship Scheme (through Internship Portal).
- 4. Students will become eligible to avail the benefits of Placement. (Through AICTE Placement Portal. Especially for rural areas).
- 5. Students will become eligible to participate in National and International level competition organized by AICTE.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE & GUIDELINES

Admission is purely on merit / entrance examination & is subjects to availability of seats as per the direction issued by University of Mumbai & Government of Maharashtra time to time. A transparent admission procedure is followed strictly based on the student norms. Any modification in admission guidelines will be notified on the college notice board at time of admission. The public is cautioned not to fall prey to any misleading information regarding admission in the college against donation.

- All admission with be done as per the norms of the University of Mumbai.
- A student seeking admission to the college should present himself / herself with an application in the prescribed form duly filled and signed by him/her and by his/her parents / guardian.

COLLEGE RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT

On admission each student will receive an IDENTITY CARD No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the possession of a valid identity card, which must be produced on demand by any competent authority.

- 1. Each student admitted to the college is expected to behave inside and outside the college in an orderly and disciplined manner and to have regard for the staff and good name of the college.
- 2. All students are answerable to the Principal, Vice Principal and members of the staff for their conduct in the college for their behavior outside and inside the college if it adversely affects the reputation of the college appropriate action may be taken within the principle of natural justice and equity.
- 3. Insubordination language or conduct in any form is sufficient reasons for the rustication or dismissal of student
- 4. Any form of ragging or intimidation and threatening of any student by other student is strictly prohibited and is liable to the most severe penalties.
- 5. Smoking, consumption of alcohol ,drug possession and distribution of drug chewing of tobacco pan and spitting is strictly prohibited in the college premises and college gatherings .The above offence' is punishable under the Mumbai Police Act, and the offenders will be severely dealt with as per the law.
- 6. The playing of cards and any form of gambling in the college premises is prohibited
- 7. Students must attend classes, practicals and tutorials according to the Time -Table on all working days of the college Absence may lead to loss of a term. A term is granted to a student whose attendance is above 75% and who completes the course of study prescribed. Employed students are not entitled for any concessions
- 8. Student should take care to be punctual. They will not be admitted into the class room if they are late by more than five minutes, Attendance Register will be sent to the classes and the student mark absent for that lecture will be considered to have been absent for that full day.
- 9. Absence from lecture must be Justified in writing in stipulated time. and if illness is the cause a medical certificate must be submitted immediately.
- 10. Students must not attend classes other than their own.
- 11. Students are not allowed to form any society, group make collections, sell tickets hold meeting invite person to address them and go on excursions or picnic without the permission of the Principal.
- 12. All notices put up on the notice board or any announcements made must have previous approval of the Principal.
- 13. All the associations and committees constituted by the Principal to conduct various student activities should not hold meetings and publish wall papers hand bills etc. without prior approval of the Principal.
- 14. Every kind of demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the college or disputes any activity in the college is banned.
- 15. Attendance for tests and examinations conducted by the college is compulsory. Defaulters should be not allowed to appear in the Annual Examination or Examinations conducted by the University.
- 16. Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the premises neat and tidy. Damaging the property of the college by disfiguring walls, doors, fitting or breaking furniture etc, is a breach of discipline and the guilty will be duly punished.
